Thrive Investment Opportunities

Housing Stability

Support financial literacy, credit-building and first-time homeownership.

- Support housing navigation and credit repair services
- Increase financial literacy programs, including banking, savings and budgeting



Educational Advancement

Strengthen English and Math proficiencies for 4th-6th graders and empower parents as advocates.

- Expand tutoring programs
- Increase parent engagement and education regarding family literacy supports and college preparation/requirements
- Help develop additional local, bilingual, credentialed teachers



Workforce Development

Expand career pathways through entrepreneurship and training programs.

- Invest in paid internships to build experience, resumes, technical and professional skills
- Support young people's on-the-job training in their areas of interest, e.g., ag-technology, arts, etc.



Mental Health Support

Increase access to community-based wellness programs, peer support networks and destigmatize mental health care.

- Expand wellness tools and skill-building for children
- Increase accessible programs for people of all ages, especially young adults, essential workers, families of color and the LGBTQ+ community.

WHY? The Need is Great

The data shows there are great disadvantages and disparities for many of our neighbors around basic human needs, such as housing, education, economic stability and mental health. Funding these specific areas will create opportunity and measurable impact.

- Since 2014, median home prices increased by 95%, while median income for a family of four in Monterey County has increased 50%.

- Only 21.4% of 7th grade students meet or exceed math competencies and only 38.9% meet or exceed English/Language Arts competencies.

- Only 57.6% of Monterey County households have the income level needed to afford the basic costs of living. (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed (ALICE) threshold)

HOW?

Our Approach

- **DATA** – We analyzed over **15 community reports** to identify key challenges.
- **NARRATIVE** – We engaged **nearly 100 residents** through listening sessions and interviewed **25+ local leaders** to understand real-life experiences.
- **ACTION** – We are investing in solutions that address systemic barriers and create lasting change.

What We Heard: Common Challenges

- **Housing** – High rent and limited homeownership opportunities
- **Financial Barriers** – Low credit scores affecting economic mobility
- **Education Gaps** – Academic struggles in foundational subjects
- **Workforce Challenges** – Limited access to career growth opportunities
- **Mental Health Struggles** – Stigma and lack of accessible resources
