

Pajaro Community Grants Program

A summary of project and community impact goals from grant recipients funded by the Pajaro Community Grants Program



Welcome Message

In December 2024, the Community Foundation for Monterey County created the Pajaro Community Grants Program. Grants were made possible by California Storm Relief Funds (Assembly Bill 102) allocated by the County of Monterey.

We established a volunteer grant committee comprised of a Pajaro business representative, a County of Monterey representative, County Supervisor Glenn Church, and three community residents, including a youth resident, to review applications and provide recommendations.

This program awarded grants to 22 organizations to increase the ability of the community to prepare for, respond to, and recover from emergencies and natural disasters. The Pajaro Community Grants Program awarded more than \$1.8 million.

The following is a list of organizations and the work they will be doing in Pajaro.


Catholic Charities Diocese of Monterey - Pajaro Resilience and Beautification Initiative

The Pajaro Resilience and Beautification Initiative will benefit the Pajaro community. Through this initiative, Catholic Charities will provide bilingual and culturally appropriate emergency preparedness and resilience workshops open to all Pajaro residents. The beautification component which includes home gardens and education will support the emotional healing of 100 Pajaro households.

The disaster-related workshop topics we selected are common knowledge gaps identified in our Pajaro caseload. These topics include creating an evacuation/emergency plan, mold remediation and awareness, home and renter's insurance, and dealing with debt.

Additionally, Catholic Charities will garner community resiliency through this initiative by providing tools and training on home gardening and nutrition education. Catholic Charities will convene 100 Pajaro households and gardening experts to create a supportive space to learn about planting vegetables and fruit trees, share experiences, and foster community. Catholic Charities will lean on community experts and the internal nutrition team to provide gardening and nutrition educational workshops.

Center for Community Advocacy (CCA) - Tenants' Rights Advocacy and Education

CCA helps farmworker and low-income families organize housing-site committees for the purpose of improving substandard conditions in the housing units that they occupy. CCA also helps families to mobilize members from the various housing committees to advocate for the construction of new, quality, affordable housing for farmworkers and other low-income working families.

Centro Binacional Para El Desarrollo Indigena Oaxaqueno (CBDIO) - Building Indigenous Farmworker Resilience in Pajaro

Centro Binacional Para El Desarrollo Indigena Oaxaqueno (CBDIO) will be doing outreach and providing direct services in English, Spanish, and Mixteco. The main focus will be on workers' rights, language access rights with healthcare and social services programs, and navigation assistance with eligibility and enrollment for public programs. CBDIO's team hopes to share vital information so that families can not only be more prepared for potential disasters but also attain more security as they continue to recover from past crises.

Community Agroecology Network (CAN) - Community Food Sovereignty: Food Aggregation and Distribution through Community Garden Renovation and Reconnection

The Community Agroecology Network, in partnership with Tierras Milperas, will work to renovate and upgrade the garden infrastructure of Pajaro Community Garden, impacted by the 2023 flooding. The revitalization of garden infrastructure will be coupled with the piloting of a food aggregation and distribution system based on agroecological climate-resilient farming practices by and for farmworker families. The project will be accompanied with a workshop series focused on food processing and storage, and will address food insecurity during the winter months when there is little work in the agricultural fields and less available garden produce.

Loaves, Fishes & Computers (LFC) - Digital Equity for Resiliency for Pajaro's Business Owners & Seniors

LFC will provide computers for small business owners and offer them basic and intermediate digital literacy classes, which includes how to use business-oriented software for finances, sales, marketing, and communications. Business owners will be able to log on to federal, state and local resources regarding disaster relief and economic opportunities. They will learn how to create marketing materials, invoices and contracts, operate their businesses online, and communicate with employees, customers and colleagues.

LFC will provide Pajaro's seniors with Chromebooks, tablets or iPads, and will help them master usage with their devices in individualized and small group classes. Everyone will learn how to protect themselves online with LFC's Internet and Social Media Safety guidelines. LFC offers tools, resources, and experiential opportunities to support Pajaro's residents so that they may effectively, safely and successfully navigate the expanding digital landscape.

Monterey Bay Economic Partnership (MBEP) - Pajaro Business Group Incorporation and Resiliency Project

The funding associated with this grant request has two objectives: 1) To hire a project management consultant that will support the Pajaro Business Group's organizational development and incorporation and 2) To develop and offer a coordinated schedule of practical business development training opportunities to strengthen resiliency, especially in addressing disasters while also increasing engagement in participation. Mujeres en Accion - Pajaro Community Resources, Economic Development, and Language Access Program

Our project expands economic opportunities and support services for the Pajaro community, especially underserved Mixteco speakers. Through our existing partnership with El Pajaro CDC, we are growing in-home childcare as a business opportunity and affordable option, while collaborating with COPA to develop workforce programs for job training, career support, and business resources for undocumented and monolingual residents. Economic equity efforts focus on expanding healthcare, language services, and a Mixteco support group for 25 women in Pajaro and Watsonville to foster leadership and self-sufficiency. Additionally, disaster preparedness training and ongoing support from bilingual Community Health Workers will strengthen community resilience.

Pajaro Valley Unified School District (PVUSD) - Revitalizing Health: Reopening PVUSD's Healthy Start Center for a Resilient Pajaro

In collaboration with partners Salud Para La Gente (SPLG) and Second Harvest Food Bank (SHFB), PVUSD is opening a reimagined and combined Resource Center on the Pajaro Middle School campus to provide direct access to healthcare and social services. At this location, PVUSD will provide Healthy Start Services for students and families that include school supplies and referrals to community resources – from parent education programming to behavioral health referrals. SPLG will provide health services in a clinic setting. And SHFB will operate a food pantry and offer nutrition education.

Casa de la Cultura is a hub for Pajaro residents offering services and enrichment programs to the community. The Casa is also home to the Pajaro Disaster Long Term Recovery Alliance, providing critical meeting space for the residents and business groups, as well as the Land Use Subcommittee. This grant will provide funding to enhance the interior and exterior of the Casa, creating a space that reflects the culture of local residents. Families from Pajaro and surrounding areas will benefit from an enhanced Casa de la Cultura Center in Pajaro as it becomes a community center that they can be proud of.

Salud Para La Gente - Expanding Access to Care in Pajaro

To address social and health inequities and foster healthy child development, life-long wellbeing, and resilience for Pajaro community residents, Salud is partnering with PVUSD to remodel and reopen a health clinic on the grounds of Pajaro Middle School. Salud previously ran a pediatric clinic at the site, which closed due to severe flood damage. In reopening the facility, the clinic is being physically expanded and improved and will feature enhanced services for the entire Pajaro community, not just pediatric patients. The clinic will house two complementary programs that address the needs of the vibrant but hard hit Pajaro community: PVUSD's Healthy Start program and Salud's comprehensive health services. Please note: This clinic is anticipated to open in September 2025.

Second Harvest Food Bank Santa Cruz County - Food for Resilient Children and Families in Pajaro

This grant project will play a crucial role in supporting the Pajaro community by addressing one of its most fundamental needs: access to food. We will open a Food Market Pantry, designed as a store where community members can "shop" around and take what they need. The Food Market Pantry will be open twice a week, with hours centered around high-traffic peak times, so most community members can benefit from the market. Through a long-established partnership with PVUSD, we aim to ensure that both students and families of Pajaro have sufficient food at home, enabling them to focus on learning and fully engage in school activities.
