2026 GRANT GUIDELINES

ABOUT THE BIG SUR FUND, IN MEMORY OF WESTON CALL

Founded in 2018, the Big Sur Fund (BSF), in memory of Weston Call was created to provide residents, businesses, and visitors an opportunity to pool their giving and bring positive change to communities in Big Sur. The fund also responds to disasters through the Big Sur Disaster Relief Fund.

BSF GRANTS

Each year, the BSF determines where its available grant dollars can be placed for greatest impact on the Big Sur community. Using these grantmaking guidelines, the BSF Advisory Council, made up of community volunteers, will carefully review grant applications and recommend a slate of grants once a year to the CFMC board, which has final authority in grant decisions.

2026 GRANTMAKING PRIORITIES:

The BSF seeks to support nonprofit organizations that have the leadership and capacity to provide important community resources and services in Big Sur, defined as Mal Paso Creek south to the County line.

It supports nonprofit organizations working in **Health, Safety, Education, Arts & Culture**, and **Community Stewardship**, addressing the following funding priorities:

- Create additional funding for health, fire, and safety needs through Big Sur nonprofits
- Support educational, cultural, and historical programs
- Aid sustainable tourism and destination stewardship efforts
- Create and enhance community partnerships
- Support nonprofits providing services in Big Sur

Funding will be considered for the following types of requests:

- **Program Support:** for the expansion or refinement of existing programs and new programs that show the promise of impact and sustainability
- **Operating Support:** unrestricted grants to organizations that have a proven track record of community benefit in Big Sur
- **Capital Support:** for costs associated with buildings and/or facilities located in Big Sur

GRANT AWARD:

A total of \$30,000 will be available for grantmaking in 2026. Grants are expected to range from a minimum of \$1,000 to a maximum of \$5,000. The total grant amount, number and size of grants awarded may vary depending on the Advisory Council's assessment of a proposed project's impact to Big Sur. Grant recipients will be expected to use all funds and provide a written evaluation of the project within 12 months from the grant date.

ELIGIBILITY:

Grants will only be considered for projects and programs serving Big Sur communities, defined in this case as Mal Paso Creek south to the County line.

- 501(c)3 nonprofit organizations
- Public programs, such as school activities and programs not included in normal curricula, parks, public health, etc.
- Church-sponsored activities with benefits to the entire community (e.g. a food pantry)
- Organizations and collaboratives that are not legally incorporated—for these, CFMC requires an agreement with a “Fiscal Sponsor” defined as a tax exempt 501(c)3 organization accountable for financial management of the grant.
- Organizations may only submit one application. However, if an organization is serving as a fiscal sponsor for a collaborative or unincorporated group, they can also apply for a grant to benefit their organization.

WHAT GRANT FUNDS MAY SUPPORT:

- Pre-development or construction costs for facility construction or renovation
- Matching grants to leverage other funding
- Developmental costs for new programs
- Equipment, materials and/or facilities expenses that directly benefit participants or are an identifiable part of a project

WHAT GRANT FUNDS WILL NOT SUPPORT:

- Projects that discriminate or with political or partisan purposes
- Religious activities or services that are non-secular and/or promote a religious doctrine
- Funding to schools and public agencies that would supplant tax-supported, mandated services
- Individual sports teams
- Annual fundraising campaigns or events
- Creation of, or addition to, endowment funds
- Payment of debt or legal settlements
- Expenses incurred prior to the grant award date
- Attendance at conferences for staff or volunteers
- Research projects

- The grantseeker to proofread the proposal/report before submission;
- The incorporation of the organization’s voice; and
- Including local data and information to personalize and support their statements.

Grant requests to the Big Sur Fund in Memory of Weston Call are due **by 11:59 pm, August 7, 2026**, or earlier. Funding decisions will be announced in October.
